President's Notes



While enjoying a concert the other day, my thoughts turned to the wonderful impact that the Rochester Music Guild has made on our

musical community. Our members have generously given of their time, talents, energy, and finances—often without fanfare—to advance the growth and appreciation of the music scene here in Rochester.

Perhaps one of our most exciting programs is our Scholarship Competition which is held each year to promote, encourage and honor talented young musicians who truly represent the future of this art form. This year, in order to accommodate the ever increasing number of string and piano students who audition each year, and to allow younger musicians the opportunity to compete, the Guild has decided to create a Junior Division Competition in string and piano for grades 6-8.

Along with the announcement of this new Junior Division comes the need to make our scholarship endowment funds sustainable. We currently have \$27,000 in our Scholarship Endowment Funds. The interest from these funds partially pays for the scholarships each year. Our hope is to have enough money in the Scholarship Funds so that they are self-sustaining every year in perpetuity.

The following Memorial Funds were all established to honor individuals who have contributed so much to music in the Rochester area.

Carter Douglas - Piano

Carter was spontaneous, creative, caring, athletic and very musical. Those who knew her often recall hearing her play piano on a summer night, with the windows open and Bach pouring forth. Following her untimely death in 1986, family and friends from this community and

across the country worked to establish a scholarship fund that would enable other young highschool-age musicians to share in new musical experiences that would help broaden and deepen their musical understanding and maturity. It is only fitting that the gift be shared and continue on forever in today's young musicians.

Sally Duffy - Voice

Sally was a two-time President of the Music Guild and an ardent supporter of the Guild's mission. She had a passion for the arts in general and for music in particular, especially choral music. Joe Duffy made a contribution in memory of his wife, Sally, shortly after her death from cancer in July 1994. He placed no stipulations on the donation – he simply wanted to honor Sally in memory of her devotion to music and the human voice. He was delighted when the Rochester Music Guild elected to place the money in a designated fund to be used for an annual vocal scholarship in her name.

Georgia Daniels - Strings

Georgia's cousin, Virginia Amundsen, was instrumental in the development of this fund, honoring Georgia for over 22 years of dedication, teaching strings and directing orchestras in the Rochester Public Schools. Georgia was always willing to share her knowledge with other teachers in the school system, and volunteered to document guidelines and standards for the teaching of stringed instruments in the Rochester Public Schools. Many of Georgia's students competed successfully for concertmaster positions in the nation's top university music programs, and went on to become professional musicians.

Carl Schroedel - Winds

This memorial was named in honor of Carl's support of the Rochester Symphony Orchestra and his service on the Rochester Music Guild Board. The Rev. Carl Schroedel passed away

Suddendorf Memorial Scholarship Awards

Towards the end of the school year, the Music Guild also grants three additional awards to an outstanding senior from John Marshall, Mayo and Century High Schools. The Suddendorf Memorial Scholarship Award honors Sid Suddendorf and his wife Carol, who were prominent members of the Rochester musical community for many years.

Sidney Suddendorf began his career with the Rochester Public Schools in 1946 as a music teacher. He taught music at the junior high, senior high, and junior college levels. When John Marshall opened, he became its first Choral Teacher. In 1966 he became the first Choral Teacher at Mayo High School. After several years at Mayo he became the District Music Consultant, a position he held until his retirement in 1979. Sid died in 1986. Meet Board Member George Malkasian



George Malkasian is new to the Music Guild board this year, filling a newly-created position as the Grants committee chair. Last year, the Guild board decided to formalize the process by which we extend grants to fulfill our goal of "promoting and

enhancing music in our community." Our new process will allow us to help a wider range of Rochester music organizations.

We were very lucky that George was available to take this position, as his experience includes many years of writing grants, as well as 10 years on the National Cancer Institute committee that reviews and approves huge grants for medical research.

George and his wife, Mary Ellen, have been in Rochester since 1955. After a stint in the US Navy during World War II, college, medical school, and internship, George accepted a residency at the Mayo Clinic. Except for a brief return to the Navy, they've been here ever since. George and his wife both grew up in Massachusetts and attended schools in New England....but that's not how they met! Mary Ellen had lost her mother as a teenager and her father eventually re-married.....to George's aunt! So they met at her father's wedding.....and are still living happily ever after.

George and Mary Ellen raised three children in Rochester, all of whom were involved in public school music. All three sang in various choral ensembles, and one daughter played violin in the Mayo High School orchestra. Mary Ellen, George says, is "the musician in the family." She sings in the Rochester Chorale, taught music here in the public schools, accompanies Bella Voce (an auditioned choir for women in grades 8-12, open to singers within commuting distance of Rochester), and plays for church services and anywhere else her talents are needed. George gives Mary Ellen all the credit for his interest in music....he's an enthusiastic member of the audience, rather than a performer.

George currently serves on the board of Bella Voce and also on the board of L.I.F.E. (Learning Is ForEver). L.I.F.E. provides social and personal growth opportunities for adults ages 55 and older in the form of stimulating humanities-based educational programs.

George is already off to a flying start as Grants chair, bringing his committee together last summer to review and approve grants to *nine* Rochester music organizations! We are so happy to welcome George to the RMG board!

This will be a great way to "get behind the scenes" for the Rochester Chamber Music Series January 9th performance at Rochester's Christ United Methodist Church (7:30 p.m. performance).

Pure Passion

2009 Senior Scholarship Awards

The Rochester Music Guild, along with the Rochester Area Keyboard Club/Local Association and the Southeastern Minnesota Suzuki Association, is proud to support the Young Musicians of Southeastern Minnesota recital series for teenage classical musicians.

The first concert will be held on Friday, December 4, 2009, at 7:00 pm. Musicians must register for this concert by November 27.

The second concert will be held on Friday, January 15, 2010, at 7:00 pm. Musicians must register for this concert by January 8, 2010.

The third and final concert will be held on Friday, March 5, 2010, at 7:00 pm. Musicians must register for this concert by February 26, 2010.

Students must be 13 years of age or older to perform. Solo and ensemble performances are welcome. Performers should represent the highest standards of preparation and musicality. Memorization is preferred. Students must find and pay their own accompanists.

There is no performance fee. A basket for donations will be displayed at each event. Please consider a donation to keep our expenses as low as possible.

Teachers may register two students for each program by mail, phone, or e-mail. You need not be a member of one of the sponsoring organizations to present a student. We wish to include as many teachers and students as possible from all around our area.

Registration must include the student's name, a complete description of the piece to be performed, contact information, and the name of the school that the student attends.
