Membership Update/Opportunity

As of December 1st, Rochester Music Guild had received 141 membership donations for the 2014/2015 season representing **190** members. This is the highest number of members since 2010/2011, and demonstrates the strong ongoing community support for Rochester Music Guild.

RMG awarded IBM Community Grant

In October, Rochester Music Guild was awarded a grant of **\$2,000** from the **IBM Community Grant** program. The grant monies are being used to help cover expenses in 2014 for the **50th Anniversary Concert** and the **Lunch & Learn**.

Attention IBMers

Rochester Music Guild recently was **approved** by IBM to participate in the **IBM Matching Grant Program**. If you are an active or retired IBM employee, you can complete an IBM matching grant form and send it along with your donation to Rochester Music Guild. IBM will match 1-to-1 (100%) of eligible donations by active IBM employees, or ¹/₂-to-1 (50%) for eligible donations by retired IBM employees.

Matching grant forms can be submitted for donations made in the past 12 months, so any eligible donations made in 2014 would qualify. Membership donations, as well as donations to Rochester Music Guild endowment funds, are eligible for IBM matching grants. Donations for fundraising events, such as Garden of Note vouchers or Herberger's coupon books, are not eligible.

Got Stock?

Do you own stock in a company like **IBM** or **Apple** or **Google**, where the current stock price is a lot higher than what you paid when you bought your shares? Or do you own shares in a company going through *inversion* like **Medtronic** or **Burger King**, where the inversion requires a stock sale and re-purchase that will be a taxable event. If you answered **YES** to either question, you could make a non-profit organization like Rochester Music Guild very happy and get a nice tax deduction for yourself by donating some of those shares.

Stock donations to Rochester Music Guild (RMG) can be made through Rochester Area Foundation (RAF). RAF will sell the stock and pass 100% of the stock sale proceeds to RMG. You will get a letter from RAF that shows the value of the shares on the day they were transferred to RAF, and you can take this amount as a charitable gift tax deduction.

For example, let's say you had the foresight or good fortune to buy 100 shares of Medtronic stock back when the share price was \$10. If you gave those shares to RMG by transferring the shares from your brokerage account to RAF on a day when the stock price is \$65 per share and the stock sale proceeds were \$6,500, you would be able to take a charitable gift tax deduction

of \$6,500 and RMG would receive the stock sale proceeds of \$6,500.

Or maybe you bought IBM shares in the early Lou Gerstner years when the stock price (adjusted for stock splits) was \$20 and you donate 50 shares to Rochester Music Guild by transferring the shares to Rochester Area Foundation on a day the stock price is \$160. RAF would sell the shares and 100% of the stock sale proceeds (\$8,000 in this example) would go to Rochester Music Guild and you could take a charitable gift tax deduction of \$8,000.

Recipe of Note!

History gets recorded, in a variety of formats, and evokes various images. Dear to many guild members, and others, are the recipes found in each of the two cookbooks compiled in past years by the guild. Names of contributors remind us of those that are no longer part of our life these days; events noted remind us of memorable times shared with others. Here is one such recipe which might bring memories and/or add to thememories made at your table this holiday season.

Gift of the Magi Bread

1/2 cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
1 tsp. vanilla
2 cups flour
1 tsp. baking soda
1/4 tsp. salt
3/4 cup chopped dates
1 cup mashed banana
1 (11 oz.) can mandarin oranges, drained
1 (6 oz) pkg semisweet chocolate chips
1 cup shredded coconut
2/3 cup sliced almonds
1/2 cup chopped maraschino cherries

Cream the butter and sugar together. Add eggs. Beat well. Add vanilla. Sift together the dry ingredients. Stir into creamed mixture just to incorporate. Stir in the rest of ingredients, reserving

1/3 cup of the almonds. Turn batter into two greased and floured 7x3-inch loaf pans. Place reserved almonds on top.Bake at 350 degrees for 55-70 minutes or until tests done with a toothpick. When cooled, sprinkle with confectioner's sugar, if desired. Yield 2 loaves.

The Nutcracker again? You bet! Actually, the RSOC does not have a long history with Tchaikovsky's holiday gift to us all. Yes, in years past we've done excerpts from favorite dances found mostly in the popular "Nutcracker Suite." However we have presented an "essentially complete" version only a couple times.

The last time was two seasons ago, and it was a revelation. The slant taken by the Allegro Dance Company and School was breathtaking. The costumes and sets were topnotch and the choreography was full of new ideas and thoughtful touches that made the entire show a joy.

A joy, too, was the number of young faces in the audience. We've worked hard to attract youngsters to more of our events. We saw a gratifying number at the Sunday matinee of our film music opener in October. And we're planning a special Halloween concert for youngsters next season. Yet The Nutcracker remains our top attraction for youth, in part, no doubt, because many of them are related to the dancers on stage.

Still, a lot of us who are far removed from the dancers who perform the ballet remain captivated by its fabulous music, magical story and huggable characters. I look forward to The Nutcracker every time I'm able to do it. And each time, when I bury my head in the score once again, I am reminded of how wonderful and how difficult it is. Tchaikovsky was a master at creating music that sounds simple but beneath the surface teems with notes, rhythms and gestures that remain eternally challenging.

The Nutcracker again? You bet! Call it sheer joy.
