## 2015 Scholarship Competition and April Recitals

The Rochester Music Guild hosted its 51st Annual Scholarship Competition on March 7-8th. Seventy-seven students competed in four divisions for over \$6600 in scholarship funds. Twelve professors of music from universities and colleges in Minnesota and Iowa judged the competition, which was held at Christ United Methodist Church.

The Rochester Music Guild Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners as follows: **Senior Piano Division:** Curtis Baum, Anna Chopp, and Stephanie Deng. **Junior Piano Division:** Helen Li, Clara Xu, and Steven Yang. **Senior Strings Division:** Alexander Scheel (violin), Hannah Lai (violin), and Natalie Tran (cello). **Junior Strings Division:** Hannah Reinschmidt (violin), Michael Hickey (cello) and Breanna Shen (violin). **Senior Winds/Brass Division:** Grace Sullivan (flute), Stefanie Tetzloff (trumpet) and Annika Johnson (french horn). **Junior Winds/Brass Division:** Breaa Lee Amundson (flute), Sue Simha (flute), and Sidney Clarke (flute). **Voice Division:** Spencer Ketterling, Mackenzie Graham, and Calli McCartan.

An additional competition for a \$1500 scholarship to attend a summer music camp was also held. Henry Wang, prior 1st place winner of the RMG Senior Piano Division, won the scholarship. He will attend the International Academy of Music Castelnuovo di Garfagnana in Italy this summer.

One recommendation letter, in the application, was from the applicant's piano instructor at the University of Minnesota. Herein the professor stated, "In my capacity as a judge of international competitions and a faculty member in many international festivals...I come in contact with hundreds of young pianists around the world.... In my opinion, Henry Wang belongs to the elite group of pianists in his age group in the world. My internationally renowned colleagues who've heard him play feel the same way." In his essay for the application, Henry wrote, "My dream goal is to become a world renowned pianist and to bring the beauty of music to people all around the Earth. I hope to achieve success on the scale of Horowitz."

## Overall reflections from a Scholarship Judge

Marty Hodel, a professor at St. Olaf who judged the Woodwinds/Brass competition, wrote the scholarship committee as follows:

"I just wanted to say how impressed I was with the competition yesterday, and how grateful I was to be a part of it. Everything about the way it was run, the way the students conducted themselves and the positive and friendly attitudes that were in evidence by the staff showed that it was well-organized and smoothly-run. Please pass along my congratulations for a successful competition and my thanks to your colleagues for making my experience such a pleasant one, and for all you do to bring great music to students in the Rochester area."

**Meet Board Member****Julianne Hagan**

*Musician, RMG Scholarship Co-chair!*

Julianne was born in Wichita Falls, TX. Her father was an adept engineer. Her mother was an accomplished pianist. From an early age Julianne sought to follow in her footsteps.

Throughout her growing up years, piano lessons (for 11 years) and singing in choirs were her favorite activities.

Julianne attended Baylor University in Waco, Texas, where she majored in accounting. Thereafter she received an MBA degree from Baylor. In 1990, Julianne married Dr. John Hagan, who was currently training at Mayo Clinic in Rochester. Music was a part of his family heritage, too!

After working as a CPA in early years, Julianne decided to stay home to raise their three daughters: Bethany (22), Christina (20) and Mary (15). Music filled their home as mother and daughters prepared and presented programs for church functions, schools, retirement centers and assisted living homes. In addition to singing, the girls are all accomplished pianists and have competed in the Rochester Music Guild scholarship competition. In 2010, Christina won first place in the senior piano division, and Mary placed in the junior piano division in 2013 and 2014.

Julianne has been actively involved in the music ministry at Calvary Evangelical Free Church in Rochester for many years. For 11 years she co-directed their children's choir and helped produce 24 musicals. She currently sings in the adult choir at church and serves as a worship team leader as well as a soloist and pianist for church services, weddings and funerals.

She was asked to join the RMG board this past year and to co-chair the scholarship competition. Combining her love for music with the skills needed for this position, such as writing the SEMAC grant application and budget planning, made this board position a good fit for her.

Julianne certainly enjoys working with Sharon Schmoll and they both enjoyed working together along with the many volunteers, at the recent 2015 51st Annual RMG Scholarship Competition!

**Meet Board Member Sharon Schmoll**

*Retired Computer "Scientist", choir engaged, number cruncher!*

Sharon's interest in music basically spans her lifetime. She was born in Indianapolis, to parents who both loved and supported music as well as participating firsthand. Prior to her fourth birthday her family moved to a small town in southwest Iowa, which Sharon identifies as the town where she was raised. Her mother played piano and sang in the church choir. She also directed the church choir for many years, and sang for weddings and funerals. Her father loved music and supported all efforts. Sharon began studying piano at age seven.

During high school she played clarinet in the school band as well as in small ensemble group. High school years also found her in the school chorus, madrigal group, vocal ensembles and soloist vocal parts. Following her public school education she went on to Drake University where she graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree. She continued in band during college years, along with participating in Choir and University Chorus.

Since coming to Rochester she was a member of the Robert Oudal Chorale for many years, then spent about 15 years with the Rochester Symphony Orchestra and Chorale. Sharon served on the Board of the Rochester Symphony Chorale for several years. She continues her involvement with that organization through serving on committees. She has taught piano lessons for over 35 years.

Though Sharon's husband is "not musical [at all]" she feels very fortunate that he supports her interests. Their children played band instruments but admittedly did show more interest in athletics.

Over a number of years Sharon has become very interested in music therapy noting that research has shown how music can enhance the quality of life for seniors recovering from strokes, those with Alzheimer's, and positively affect palliative care in controlling pain and comfort levels. While she still teaches a few piano lessons she is nearing the next chapter in life..... retirement.

Originally it was a teaching job, at the middle school level, that brought Sharon to Rochester after college. We are fortunate to have her talents here in Rochester and now on the RMG board as Scholarship co-chairperson.

**Herberger's Community Days Final Report**

RMG participated in Herberger's Community Days last November, selling \$5 coupon books to members as well as at the store during the sale. Thanks to Carol Thompson, Pamela Haase, and Barbara Eakins, this fundraiser was a great success. There were **120** RMG members that purchased coupon books for themselves or that were donated to local charities. A total of **95** purchased coupon books were donated to Salvation Army (40), Goodwill (20), United Way (10), Women's Shelter (10), Ronald McDonald House (10), and Catholic Charities (5). A total of **\$2005.00** was raised by RMG through the sale of **401** coupon books. In addition, Herberger's sent RMG a bonus check (which is based on books sold and total sales during Community Days) for **\$576.23** in early January 2015 so, all totaled, the Herberger's fundraiser brought in **\$2581.23**.
