Open Board Positions for 2017-2018

Arts Advocate

Serves as an Auxiliary Board Member or on the Board of Directors, if wishes; monitors arts-related information from specified sources; sends appropriate information to RMG's Webmaster for posting on the website, rochestermusicguild.org; contacts the Webmaster with information as appropriate; attends at least one Board meeting a year, or on request, to report on activities.

Is responsible for internal communications of the Guild, through the newsletter, Bravo; determines newsletter dates (3-4 issues per year); edits, formats, and proofs the newsletter from submissions then sends document electronically to all members with e-mails; mails a printed version to members requesting such.

Garden of Note Chair

Is responsible for all aspects of the Garden of Note Sale in the spring; along with said committee, recruits volunteers to carry out the event; maintains records of participating sellers and financial data; will record income from the sale of vouchers and make deposits to the Rochester Music Guild bank account.

Grants Committee Chair

Prepares a grant application form and establishes a deadline for applications, if to be awarded. Reviews all applications and makes a recommendation to the Board as to awards to be granted in the forthcoming program year, generally September 1 through June 30 of the following year.

Membership Chair

Is responsible for production and mailing of annual membership brochure and renewal forms generally in April; is responsible for membership renewals and recruitment of new members; maintains spreadsheet pages to generate mailing labels for guild events; in consultation with the Board, organizes an annual recognition for members and prospects; serves on the Nominating Committee.

Treasurer's Update

2016 proved another solid year financially for Rochester Music Guild (RMG). On the income side, RMG was helped by being awarded an IBM Community Grant for \$2,000 and a grant from the Southeastern Minnesota Arts Council (SEMAC) for \$10,000. We also had great work from our Garden of Note and Herberger's fundraising teams which combined to bring in over \$9,000. RMG had another strong year for membership donations as well.

On the expense side, RMG continued its tradition of holding the premier music scholar-ship competition in southeastern Minnesota, with a record number of participants who were awarded a total of \$7,800 in scholar-ships and a camp scholarship of \$1,500. Lunch & Learn events presented artists, including Midori Gato, who performed and educated. Concerts with workshops and master classes by jazz and classical musicians also were highlights of 2016. RMG also supported many musical organizations in Rochester with major grants to Rochester Symphony Orchestra & Chorale and smaller grants to nine other organizations.

RMG is (still) eligible for IBM matching grants!

There was some confusion (on IBM's part) about Rochester Music Guild's eligibility for participation in the IBM Matching Grants Program. If you received a letter from IBM indicating that you made a donation to RMG that was not eligible, you can ignore it. The confusion was resolved and RMG is definitely eligible for matching grants from active and retired IBM-ers. The IBM matching grant program will be changing to an online submission (from the traditional paper form) in 2017. Watch for a future newsletter with more details once the new process is finalized by IBM. Thanks to all RMG members who submitted matching grant forms in 2016.

We are so grateful to Sargents Nursery for their ongoing support of the Rochester Music Guild's Garden of Note event. 20% of the face value of \$25 vouchers is returned back to the Guild to support local music.
