Letter From Our President

Welcome to the fall newsletter from Rochester Music Guild. My name is Alan Hansen, and I am delighted to be associated with this organization, and have the opportu-

nity to help advance the RMG mission. For many years, my wife Jolene and I have been somewhat passive members, paying for our membership, and buying garden vouchers, but not fully "getting" what this organization does. Happily that has changed.

Joining the board, this past year, has given me a much clearer picture, and with it, a strong appreciation for what RMG brings to this community. I am also deeply impressed with the extraordinary work and dedication of the RMG leadership & board, volunteers, and members, past and present, that have done so very much! Now I find the mission and focus of RMG very easy to articulate with pride.

Let me highlight some of the central activities that support the **RMG mission**:

<u>Dedicated to Music Appreciation, Education &</u> <u>Performance – Today & Tomorrow</u>

Performance - Perhaps the centerpiece of the Guild's work has been the Scholarship Competition. This event combines the elements of music appreciation, education, and performance, and reflecting a strong commitment to the future. I experienced the competition and subsequent winners' recital for the first time last year as a volunteer, and I can't say enough about the high caliber of performers. There were record numbers of participants, performing for skilled judges, in a very well run event. I left with a renewed confidence in there being a bright future for this musical art form!

Education - The Lunch & Learn series continues to be a favorite, as we have enjoyed fine programs, most recently the Mill City String Quartet. We are planning to expand our educational focus this year, launching a Young Musician Master Class series. We have received a funding commitment to pilot the first class, and are seeking funding so that we can reach students in all areas (instrumental and voice).

Support & Advocacy – RMG provides modest financial support for area musical organizations. Grant awards are made based on an assessment of educational, youth, and overall community impact. You'll have seen in earlier newsletters and membership brochures that ten area groups received funding in 2015!

- RMG provides volunteers for RSOC events.
- RMG maintains a rich website including a calendar of music events, listings of non-profit music organizations, and music instructors.

How does this happen, and can we do more?

The guild is blessed with having **generous donors** that have funded endowments from which scholarships are made. RMG is doubly blessed to have a **committed board**, and network of **enthusiastic volunteers** that undertake the programs, fund raising, and the guild's work.

We can do more, and **membership** is the key to sustaining and expanding the work of the guild! Last year RMG reached record membership levels and we hope this grows further. As of this newsletter we're not quite 90% of the way toward that objective.

Please renew your guild membership, and reach out to friends to join as well and help make this work possible.

With that in mind the guild board asked him for a few words on this transition.

He writes....This season brings the greatest life change I can remember. If someone had said to me six months ago that Kristina and I would be packing up all our earthly belongings, selling our house and moving to Rochester, I would have called them crazy. Now it's we who are crazy!

Our first weeks in Rochester have been frantic, bewildering and fun. It's been great to renew acquaintances with people and places and find out just how much Rochester has changed since we moved away 23 years ago.

As I write this toward the end of September, I am still in the "asking questions" stage, but I'm learning a lot. Our event honoring the New Founders Circle of contributors to the RSOC was smashing—a harbinger, I hope, of events to come. Not having been a symphony administrator before, I am more in the asking than answering mode right now, but so many people have been so helpful that I feel confident that this will be a great fit for me.

I've made no secret that my main goals are 1) to put the RSOC on a solid financial foundation to guarantee our lasting long into the future and 2) to get started on building a new concert hall for not just the RSOC but all concert events that happen in Rochester. Both of these are challenging, especially the new hall, but well within the realm of reality for an energetic, educated, committed city like Rochester.

I'm very heartened at the enthusiastic and supportive comments from RSOC friends throughout the community. Their welcome has been warm and generous, and I look forward to a busy yet fulfilling time back in the city where I have made more music than anywhere else in my life. Thanks to all for your continuing support.

SMILE for RMG if you shop at AMAZON

Rochester Music Guild (RMG) is a participating charitable organization for AmazonSmile. AmazonSmile is a program which shares a percentage of online sales from Amazon. If you, your kids or friends, shop online through Amazon, it is **very** easy to have those sales counted for RMG. Here's all you need to do:

1. Use web address **smile.amazon.com** instead of <u>amazon.com</u> whenever you do online shopping through Amazon. The price you pay will be exactly the same, but 0.5% of the sale will go to RMG.

2. The first time you go to **smile.amazon.com**, you will be asked to sign in to your <u>amazon.com</u> account. This is the same account you normally use when making Amazon purchases.

3. After signing in, you will be asked to choose the charitable organization for AmazonSmile to use. Enter **Rochester Music Guild** in the Search box and press Enter. You may see multiple similar organization names returned, like Rochester Symphony Guild, but **select Rochester Music Guild**.

You're done! That's all there is to it. Now any purchases you make through Amazon will generate a donation to Rochester Music Guild. But, **remember**, you must make your purchases by starting at the <u>smile.amazon.com</u> web page.

Meet Board Member Katie Livingood



Katie Livingood has joined the 2015-16 Music Guild Board of directors as membership chair. Katie grew up in the small town of Winneconne, Wisconsin, near Oshkosh. She attended Luther College, in Decorah, Iowa, where she received a Bachelors Degree in Communication Studies.

From there she went on to Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington, where she received her MA in Communication and Leadership. During her undergraduate years she played her horn in various groups, but did not study music.

These days she enjoys playing her horn, as time allows, "but completely at an amateur level." In her professional life these days, Katie serves as the Executive Director for the Southeastern Minnesota Youth Orchestras (SEMYO). She sees it as an honor, through her work with SEMYO, to help nurture young musicians in our community, knowing first-hand that their background in music can be a great asset to them without being their future profession!

Reflecting on the early track with music which she took, she notes that "when you're in a small town, you pretty much do what everyone else does." She started in band in 5th grade with most of her classmates. The "interest form" students in her hometown received in 4th grade didn't list French horn, so she defaulted to flute - like half the other girls in the class! In 7th grade she had the option to switch to horn and has played it ever since - through high school band, a community youth orchestra, college band, and now in the Rochester Community Band and occasional other opportunities.

Katie and husband, Levi Livingood, moved to Rochester in 2006 when she took a job with the Southeastern Minnesota Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America ("the bishop's office"). Thereafter, in 2008, they moved to Dodge Center. Besides her work with SEMYO, Katie serves as the Communications and Media Specialist for St. John's Lutheran Church in Kasson. Indeed, she is one busy, energetic lady!

Katie describes her husband, Levi, as "really the musician in our family," though he actually works in finance. He is an accomplished pianist and organist, playing in many area churches and community theaters.

Katie notes that while many musicians have deep explanations of the importance of music in their lives, for her it's more simple: specifically it is that she finds music simply fun! She enjoys making the notes on the page come to life and transforming her breath into beautiful sounds. And she has always enjoyed the friendships built in ensembles. Welcome Katie!

A note from Maestro Jere Lantz...

First and foremost, we'd like to thank the Guild for its generous support of our concerts and educational activities: Playing With the Pros and HoNk*SqUeAk* cRaTcH *BoOm! I'd also like to welcome you to the 2015/16 season.

We had a great time putting together the season we're about to unleash. We've been thinking for years of doing a Halloween show, so the weekend before the scary day, we're offering "Haunted Hall," with eerie pieces by Mussorgsky, Gounod, Dukas and Berlioz, including our first shot ever at the complete Symphonie Fantastique. Special event: the first part of our Friday, October 23, dress rehearsal will be a free spooky concert for kids and their parents (and grandparents, if they wish, in costume, we hope. (The orchestra will be in costume, too!) Full concerts follow on October 23rd and 24th.

A year ago Shaun Johnson, lead singer of the stupendous a cappella group Tonic Sol-Fa, asked us to read through new arrangements that had been written for his voice and his Big Band with symphony orchestra. It was a joyful evening, great fun making jazzy music with a top vocalist. So we invited Shaun and his Big Band to join us for a full concert, which is our feature for November 21 at John Marshall High School. Shaun's doing some of my favorites, including Leonard Cohen's "Hallelujah" and Frank Sinatra hit "That's Life." Can't wait!

In **December**, it's "Sounds of the Season," featuring our newly revived Chorale and a community sing of Handel's Hallelujah Chorus. Hallelujah indeed! In February we honor pieces that made symphonic history: "Blue Cathedral" by Jennifer Higdon, one of today's leading young composers; Les Préludes, by the composer who invented the symphonic poem, Franz Liszt; and the Declaration of Independence for the symphony, Beethoven's Eroica.

"Gloria!" is what we've called our March concert, opening with the Courtly Dances from Gloriana by Benjamin Britten, who wrote his opera to celebrate the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II (who just made longevity history BTW). Then it's two great settings of the traditional Latin Gloria text by Vivaldi and Poulenc (the latter premiered in Boston the night JFK took the oath of office). We finish with a brand new piece written for the occasion by our good friend Garth Neustadter, one he's called "Toward Glory."

We close our season in April by delving into the depths of the "Slavic Soul," starting on the bright note of Shostakovich's "Festive Overture," one of the two greatest overtures of the 20th century. Then it's the masterpiece from the career of Polish master Witold Lutoslawski, his Concerto for Orchestra, completed the same year as the Festive Overture. We'll close our season with the Tchaikovsky Piano Concerto No. 1 with Scott Cuellar, a young pianist (and good buddy of our pal Andrew Staupe) on the way to a great career.

Do I love this season? You bet! And you will too. Don't miss a concert. I'll see you at the symphony!

Herberger's Community Days November 11-14, 2015

With the arrival of fall the **HERBERGER'S COMMUNITY DAYS** is just around the corner. This simply fantastic fundraiser is one which any

organization like ours could only hope for. First, some history.

Herberger's is a department store, under the Bon Ton conglomerate, that is vitally interested in and supportive of the community it serves. Annually they prepare a coupon book, containing terrific bargains, for this pre-Christmas sale. As the event draws closer, the Guild will mail you an encouraging note, two coupon books, and a directive sheet for you to indicate your wishes— whether you purchase one, both, neither (DON'T FORGET TO RETURN THEM TO ME), or MANY. Every last dollar, from the \$5 purchase of each book, goes directly back to the Guild. If we sell 100 books we bank \$500. Sometimes people send an additional donation along with, or instead of buying, coupon books. The Guild very much appreciates every penny it gets from every donor. However there is yet another "**bonus**" in all this!

Herberger's offers a "bonus donation" to participating organizations, which is based on sales receipts for the total sale period. RMG's bonus is based on the percentage of books we sell compared to the total number of books sold by all participating organizations. In other words, **THE MORE BOOKS WE SELL, THE BIGGER OUR PIECE OF BONUS PIE**.

With the bonus in mind, the Guild has agreed that any donations received will be counted as books "purchased" and those books taken to a nonprofit organization for distribution to lower-income families. This way, we can have a winwin scenario: Herberger's sales are increased, and people choosing to send donations will be enhancing their donation by adding to our bonus.
