Co-President's Notes

The Rochester Music Guild Board welcomes Darlene Bannon, who recently joined the Board as producer of our "Bravo!" Newsletter. Darlene is a nurse anesthetist at St. Marys Hospital. We are delighted to have her join us in this important role

We are anticipating the culmination of the year-long efforts of our Fortieth Anniversary Committee—Lois Kennel, Judy Kereakos, DeeDee Odell and Pauli Krieger—in our traditional Annual Meeting Luncheon on June 5 and our Scholarship Honors Alumni Recital that evening—both to be held at Christ United Methodist Church. We look forward to your joining us for these special events. The year-long celebration began with the Annual Meeting Luncheon at the Marriott Hotel in May, 2003.

The Rochester Music Guild provided 16 volunteers to assist with the January 24, 2004, "Honk, Squeak, Scratch, and Boom" event. Ann Monk arranged with HyVee North for box lunches for the musicians and other workers involved. The lunches were well received and appreciated. There were 325 young participants this year; their comments ranged from, "Awesome," "Fun and Cool," "Instructors very good and patient," "A great gift to our community," to "Came with my sister and it was fun anyway," and "I'm very glad my music teacher made me come." The timing for this event was changed from September to January at the request of many of the music teachers. Fortunately, the weather cooperated!

Music Guild members bought and sold the five dollar coupon books and filled various

"working" roles during Herberger's Community Days on November 22 and February 28. Total income from the two Community Day Events was \$642.82. Watch for and support the Fall Community Day in November. These events provide good opportunities for us to earn funds to support our education and scholarship programs.

The Radio-Thon weekend March 13 and 14 found members helping in various roles at KNXR and providing bars and cookies for snacks for the workers. Guild Scholarship winners performed. The Radio-Thon raised pledges of approximately \$70,000 for the Rochester Orchestra and Chorale. Rochester Music Guild sponsors the concertmaster chair and the principal harp chair in addition to one of the ROC Concerts.

Thanks to Shirley Edmondson's dedicated efforts, "Garden of Note" sales are well underway. Vouchers in amounts of \$25 and \$50 from Sargeant's provide a way to purchase plants, trees, flower arrangements, corsages and so on while providing support for the Rochester Music Guild's "Dedication to Music Appreciation, Education and Performance Today and Tomorrow." When asked "What impact, if any, did winning an RMG scholarship have on your life?" our scholarship alumni say:

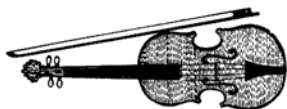
